Pronunciation Guide:

In Finnish, the stress is always on the first syllable.

Simple vowels and consonants:

- a Like the o in pot; very short.
- ä Like the a in hat; very short.
- e Like the *e* in l*e*t; very short.
- i Like *i* in s*i*t.
- u Similar to 00 in b00k but more rounded; very short.
- d Like *d* in la*dy*, but very weak.
- h Like *h* in *h*at.
- j Like the *y* in *y*et.
- l Like the *l* in s*l*eep.

- r Rolled *r*, as in Spanish or Scottish.
- s Like the s in skin; never as in nose.
- t Like the *t* in s*t*ing.
- v Like the *v* in *v*ery.

Diphthongs are pronounced as a single syllable, with the first vowel longer than the second.

- ei Very much like *ey* in th*ey*.
- oi Very much like oi in voice.
- ou Very much like *o* in s*o*, but more rounded.
- uo Somewhat like *oo o* in t*oo o*ld, rounded and as one syllable.
