### Metropolitan Tikhon, OCA delegation visit Orthodox Church of Finland

**SYOSSET, NY –** At the invitation of Archbishop Leo of Karelia and All Finland, Metropolitan Tikhon and a delegation from the Orthodox Church in America made an official visit to the Orthodox Church of Finland during the last week of February 2016. Members of the delegation included Archbishop Melchisedek of Pittsburgh and Western Pennsylvania, Archpriest John Jillions, Archdeacon Joseph Matusiak, Dr. Paul Meyendorff, and Subdeacon Jeremy Pletnikoff.

Metropolitan Tikhon and Archbishop Melchisedek concelebrated the Liturgy at New Valaam Monastery with Archbishop Leo and Bishop Arseni; met with Metropolitans Ambrosius and Elia; visited the Lintula Women's Monastery, the Valaam Lay Academy, Helsinki's Dormition Cathedral, Joensuu's theo-

logical department and seminary, and other Church sites; and participated in a one-day conference in Sweden on the current situation of migrants across Europe. Metropolitan Tikhon and Archbishop Leo also signed a cooperation agreement pledging closer ties in five major areas of Church life.

### The reinterment of Archbishop Dmitri

**DALLAS, TX –** Metropolitan Tikhon presided at the reinterment of the late Archbishop Dmitri of Dallas and the South at Saint Seraphim Cathedral here March 4-5, 2016. Archbishop Dmitri fell asleep in the Lord in retirement at the age of 87 on Sunday, August 28, 2011.

On Friday, March 4, Archbishop Dmitri's body was brought to the cathedral, after which Vespers and a Panikhida were celebrated. On Saturday, Metropolitan Tikhon and Archbishop Alejo of Mexico City and numerous clergy concelebrated the Divine Liturgy, after which Archbishop Dmitri was laid to rest in the cathedral's recently completed Resurrection Memorial Chapel. Hundreds of clergy and faithful from across the US and Mexico participated.

"Archbishop Dmitri was father of the Diocese of the South... who personally engaged with his people and his clergy, less as 'master' than as first shepherd," Metropolitan Tikhon said in his homily during the Liturgy. "At the same time, [he]



was also an uncompromising teacher of the Orthodox Christian faith who saw that we are in an age that will severely test our faith and commitment."

WASHINGTON, DC - British Broadcasting Corporation and Public Broadcasting Service interviewed Metropolitan Tikhon on the widely publicized meeting between Patriarch Kirill of Moscow and Pope Francis in Cuba February 12, 2016. In both interviews. Metropolitan Tikhon shared his insights on the encounter, including its meaning for Church relations in the US, its broader historical impact, the persecution of Christians in the Middle East, and prospects for cooperation. Also interviewed was Cardinal Theodore McCarrick, who offered a Roman Catholic perspective on the meeting.




day Life" – was developed in two addresses by Archpriest Dr. Steven Voytovich, Dean of Saint Tikhon's Seminary. Father Steven focused on
